JOIN neZEH AT THE COP21

neZEH (nearly Zero Energy Hotels) is a project co-funded by the **European Commission** within the frame of the **Intelligent Energy Europe Programme**, aiming to accelerate the rate of large scale renovations of hotels into nearly Zero Energy Buildings (nZEB), by providing technical advice to committed hoteliers and demonstrating flagship nZEB projects in the European hospitality sector. **Sixteen (16) pilot hotels** across **seven** European countries (Croatia, France, Greece, Italy, Romania, Spain and Sweden) follow a renovation plan to become nearly Zero Energy Hotels and stand out as **examples of good practice** in Europe

Join neZEH during the Paris Climate Change, COP21 conference, a unique occasion to discuss the project's results and challenges with key stakeholders, as well as to raise awareness about existing initiatives within the tourism sector and the built environment.

ENERGIES 2050, along with the Technical University of Crete (project coordinator) and the neZEH consortium partners will organise three events dedicated to neZEH (all of them opened to public), as follows:

December 8th, Le Grand Palais, ENERGIES 2050 booth, 1pm – 2pm How to enable Nearly Zero Energy strategies in the hotels sector

In this roundtable, some neZEH partners (Technical University of Crete, World Tourism Organisation - UNWTO, ENERGIES 2050, among others) will present and discuss the project's objectives, results and challenges. Debates with experts and public will follow on the topics of: energy innovation and sustainability in the accommodation sector; benefits from implementing neZEH strategies; capacity building and ways to unblock large-scale renovations in the Hotel Industry.

December 8th, Le Grand Palais, Conference room No.5, 2pm – 2:50 pm Designing low carbon strategies in the built environment: best practices

This conference will focus on solutions for designing low carbon strategies in the built environment. neZEH's global vision, actions and next steps will be presented, among other inspiring initiatives from organisations such as Solener and UNWTO.

December 10th, Le Bourget, civil society zone, MEDCOP booth, 11am – 12pm

Tourism, climate and energy: a treasure of opportunities for the territories – Lighthouse examples and experiences from the European initiative neZEH

This conference will specifically focus on lighthouse examples from neZEH, aiming to demonstrate the frontrunners experience and to enhance existing opportunities. Participants will include stakeholders from the tourism industry and buildings sector.

1. HOW TO GET THERE - LE BOURGET

Going by the RER B suburban train and Metro 7 line Shuttles for all will operate regular connections in both directions between:

- The Le Bourget station of line B of the RER and the COP21 site. All trains will stop at Le Bourget station during COP21.
- The Fort d'Aubervilliers station of line 7 of the metro and the COP21 site.

To reach these two stations:

- From Paris-Charles-de-Gaulle Airport* and the airport's hotel zone: take line B
 of the RER (towards Robinson or Saint-Rémy-lès-Chevreuse) and alight at Le
 Bourget.
- From Paris-Nord station: take line B of the RER (towards Aéroport Charles-de-Gaulle 2 TGV or Mitry-Claye) and alight at Le Bourget.
- From Paris-Orly Airport: take the ORLYVAL shuttle to the station Antony on line B of the RER, then take RER B (towards Aéroport Charles-de-Gaulle 2 TGV or Mitry-Claye) and alight at Le Bourget.
- From Paris: take line B of the RER (towards Aéroport Charles-de-Gaulle 2 TGV or Mitry-Claye) and alight at Le Bourget, or else take line 7 of the Metro (towards La Courneuve 8 mai 1945) and alight at Fort d'Aubervilliers.
- * If you wish to travel to Le Bourget directly from the station or airport: be warned, your luggage must measure at most 55x35x25 cm (size of airline hand luggage) to be accepted on the COP21 site. Large suitcases will not be allowed, and there is no left luggage centre on-site.

Coming by bus

We recommend that you use the COP21 shuttles to ensure you have a safe and easy journey. But there are also regular bus lines that run in this area:

- bus n° 152, stop "Michelet-Parc des Expositions",
- bus n° 350, stop "Michelet-Parc des Expositions",
- · Noctilien (all night bus) n° 42 from the stop "Le Bourget".

Coming by car or taxi

If you do wish to come by car, access is possible by the A86, A1 and A3, but it is difficult to park and the heavy traffic congestion on these roads means there may be long delays.

There will be a rank for taxis and chauffeured car rental services outside the COP21 site.










- Bus lines 28, 42, 52, 63, 72, 73, 80, 83, 93





















3. PARIS: METRO AND RER
